- Take a scenic drive down the Salmon River of No Return and watch for mountain goats and sheep on the steep hillsides, and the rafters floating the white water.
- Hike up Wagonhammer Spring Canyon. Keep an eye open for elk, deer, big horn sheep, along with numerous upland game birds.
- Explore the trail of Lewis & Clark when they traveled through this area in September 1805, looking for the Pacific Ocean.
- Explore the Nez Perce trails and visit the Big Hole Battle Field National Monument located 35 miles from the campground.
- Visit our local museum, Sacajawea Interpretive Center and enjoy our excellent restaurants.

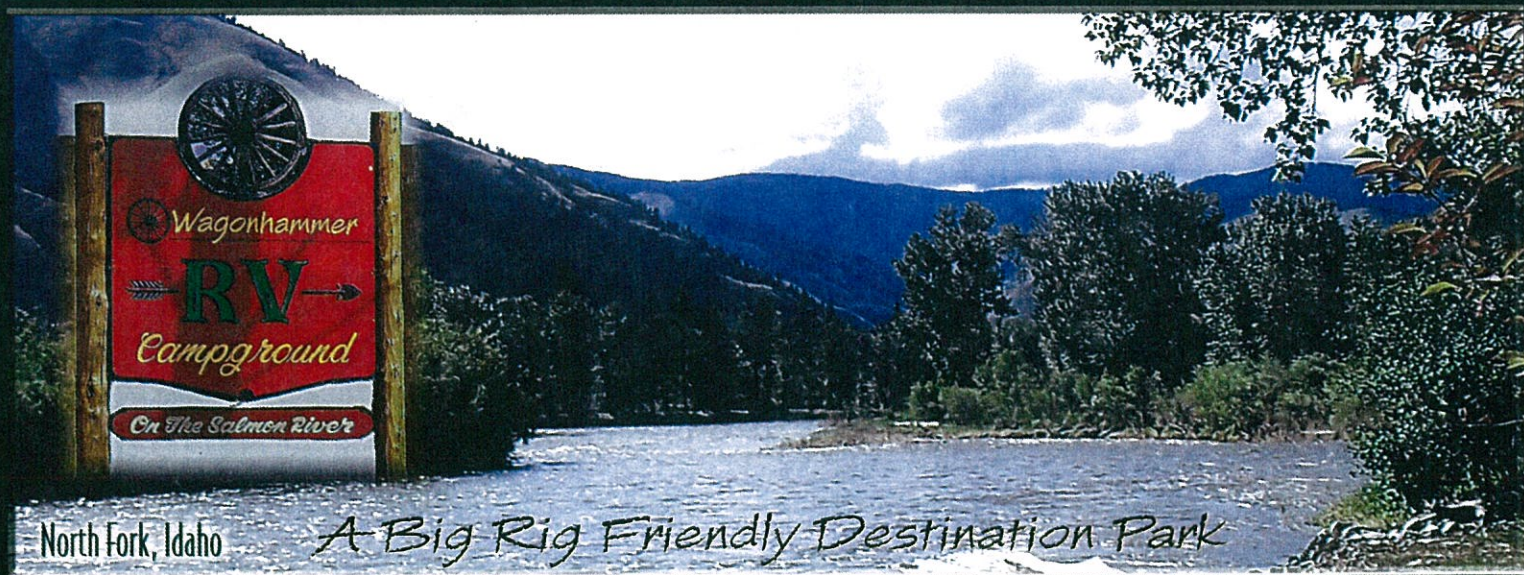

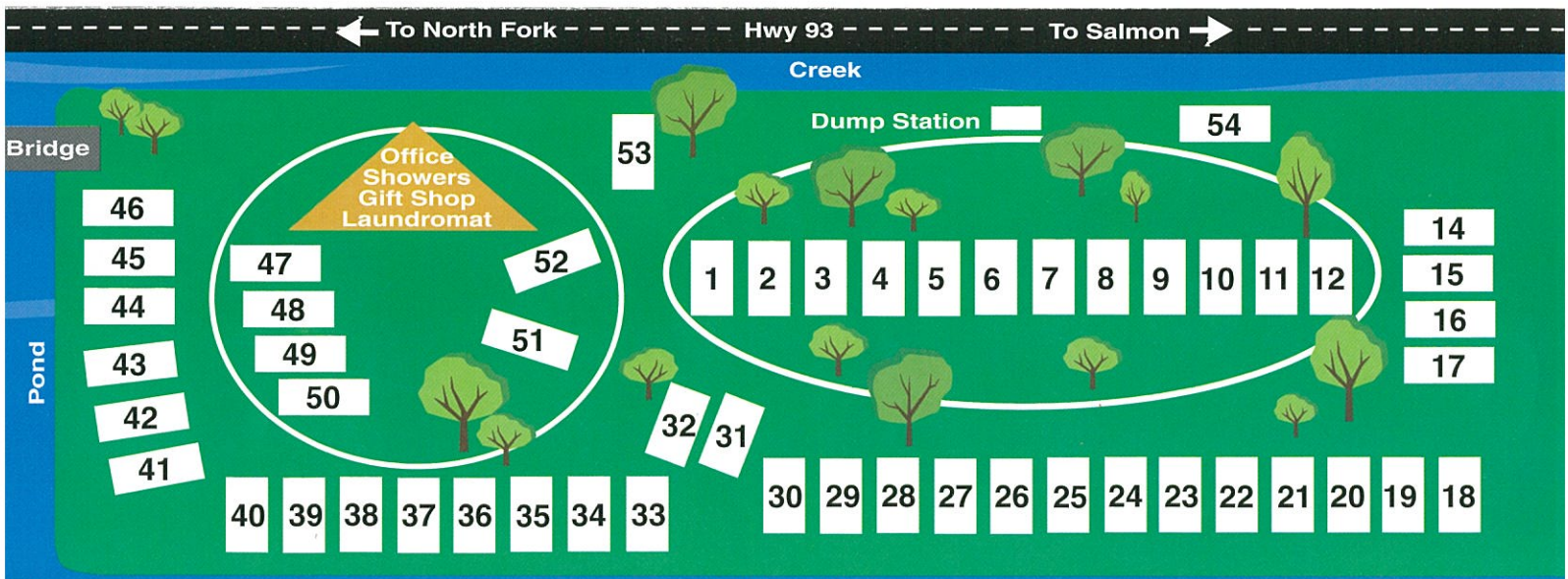

- Please observe quiet time from 10:00 pm at night until 8:00 am in the morning.
- The wind may come up suddenly at any time, so make sure your tent or awnings, etc. are secured.
- Be aware of any limbs or branches overhead that could be blown down, if there is a strong windstorm.
- Wagonhammer is not liable for any accidents, damage, or loss while staying here.
